### AN ACT

To amend 6 CMC § 2301(a) to penalize the importation of banned pesticides; and for other purposes.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE NINETEENTH NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:

Section 1. <u>Findings and Purpose</u>. The Legislature finds that although the importation of banned pesticides is prohibited in the Commonwealth, the importation of banned pesticides is not subject to the penalty imposed on the importation of contraband. Banned pesticides contain chemicals that are carcinogenic and toxic for human consumption and should be not be used in the Commonwealth. The Legislature further finds that the importation of banned pesticides should be covered by the laws penalizing the importation of contraband in order to protect and safeguard the health and safety of the people of the Commonwealth.

9 Section 2. <u>Amendment</u>. 6 CMC § 2301(a) is hereby amended by adding a new
10 subsection (9) to read as follows:

#### "§ 2301. Importation of Contraband.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly enter the Commonwealth with the intent to import, or attempt to cause another to bring or import into the Commonwealth, or conceal for the purpose of importation, any of the following items:

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(1)-(8) [<u>Unchanged</u>.].

(9) banned pesticides as defined by regulations adopted by the Bureau of Environmental and Coastal Quality."

### SENATE BILL NO. <u>19-70, HD1</u>

Section 3. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

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Section 4. <u>Savings Clause</u>. This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of this Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence at the date this Act becomes effective.

Section 5. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.
