10 Do's and Don'ts of Site Inspection

- 1. Do post your DEQ permit on site.
- 2. Do know your DEQ inspector.
- **3. Do** be proactive in protecting your BMP's.
- **4. Do** use written communications.
- **5. Do** inform DEQ prior to any changes or revisions of plans on the site.
- **6. Do** be respectful and polite to all inspectors.
- 7. **Do** follow all site rules and regulations.
- **8. Do** 'say so' if weather is causing a site problem.
- **9. Do** photograph events if the weather is causing a site problem.
- **10.Do** call and inform DEQ and request assistance if you find a site problem.





The Don'ts



- 1. Don't try to bribe any inspector.
- **2. Don't** wait for DEQ to find your site in non-compliance.
- **3. Don't** have a confrontational attitude with the inspector.
- **4. Don't** threaten to consult a higher authority (i.e.-Governor, Mayor, Director or Manager).
- **5. Don't** fall short on implementing your Erosion & Sediment Controls.
- **6. Don't** make excuses for why the site is not compliant.
- **7. Don't** be surprised by a 'joint agency' site visit/ inspection.
- **8. Don't** play one regulatory agency against another.
- **9. Don't** wait for DEQ to visit and to address issues of non-compliance.
- **10.Don't** promise to do something you do not intend to implement.
